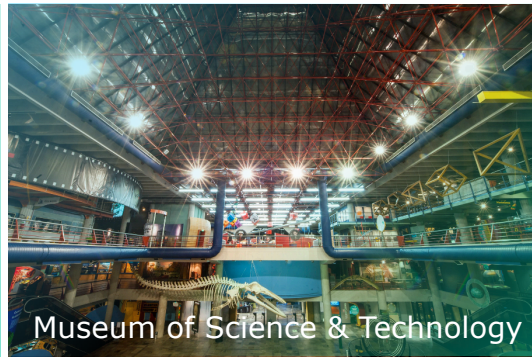

The Institutional Project for Internationalization - PUCRS-PrInt – aims to **foster international collaborative research and institutional partnerships** that contribute to research and postgraduate programs' excellence.

Sponsored by the Brazilian Federal Agency for Support and Evaluation of Graduate Education – **CAPES**, the PUCRS-PrInt **funds mobility initiatives from faculty, researchers and doctorate students from PUCRS and foreign institutions.**





PUCRS- PrInt Goals

- To foster international institutional partnerships;
- To encourage collaborative research projects;
- To promote the publication of co-authored projects and scientific studies;
- To support the mobility of PUCRS professors, researchers and doctoral students and attract faculty and researchers from international higher education and research institutions;
- To establish double degree PhD initiatives and International Graduate Programs.

Modalities of support for foreign professors and researchers:

- **Visiting Professor in Brazil** 15 days to 12 months
- **Post-Doctorate with Experience Abroad** 6 to 36 months
- **Young Talent with Experience Abroad** 6 to 36 months

Modalities of support for PUCRS professors and PhD students:

- **Working Missions for Professors** 7 to 20 days
- **Senior and Junior Visiting Professor Abroad** 3 to 36 months
- **Short training courses** 15 days to 3 months
- **Sandwich Doctorate scholarship** 6 to 12 months

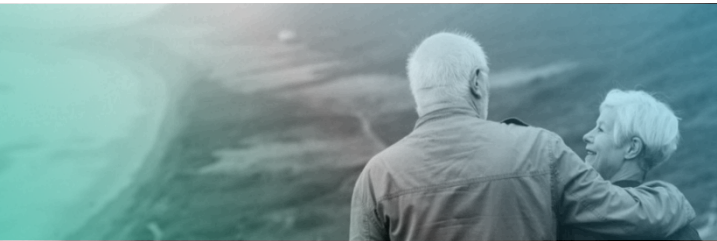
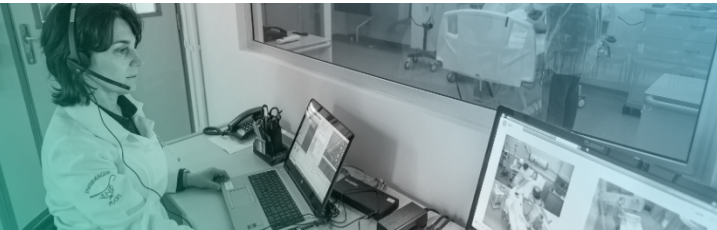

HEALTH IN HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

This theme seeks to address the clinical, psychosocial and educational aspects related to the different stages of human development, in an integrated way. Strategies aiming at the promotion of health, as well as at new treatments and development of innovative technologies will be investigated in studies in a translational perspective over the lifecycle.

- **Assessment of environmental aspects, life habits and pathological condition in child development**
- **Biopsychosocial aspects related to the individual's health in adult life**
- **Studies on aging neuropsychology and molecular mechanisms associated with neurodegenerative diseases in the elderly population**
- **Advances in drug development, diagnosis and epidemiology of neglected diseases**
- **Development of technologies and innovative processes in health**

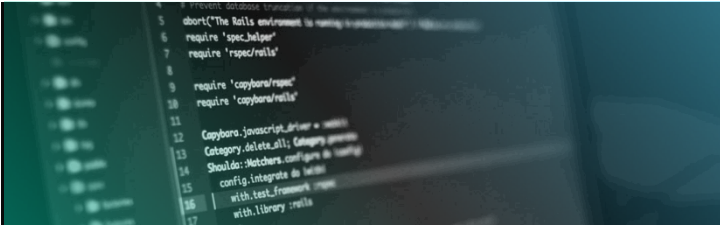




THE WORLD IN MOTION: INDIVIDUALS AND SOCIETY

The understanding of social development occurs in multiple ways, including welfare as well as human, economic, social and environmental development.
